## **Glass from the class: Students help with school art**

About 300 students from Hazelwood Elementary helped make a glass sculpture that was installed above the school's front doors yesterday. Brook White Jr., a co-owner of Flame Run, a contemporary glass art studio and gallery at 828 E. Market St., worked with the students.

The project was made possible by a gift from a former Hazelwood teacher and her husband, who want to remain anonymous.

They said they wanted to give students a learning experience that was part of a process, rather than a single event. So lesson plans were devised to cover glass-related topics in history, science and art, and youngsters got to watch glass being blown at the studio.

They also got to have a say in making part of the sculpture.
